## Philadelphia Tour

3 days, 2 nights

## Day One:

This morning, the group will depart for Philadelphia, PA and arrive mid day. On arrival, the group will have lunch followed by a guided tour of the Philadelphia Historic District which includes Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, and Christ Church. End the day with dinner at Dave and Buster's with free time for games!

Day Two:

This morning, the group will start the day at the National Constitution Center which they will learn more about the US Constitution. After lunch, the group will head over the Franklin Institute, a leading museum in science and technology followed by a quick stop at the Philadelphia Museum of Art to run the steps that Rocky Balboa made famous! The afternoon ends with an eerie visit to the Eastern State Penitentiary. This non-working prison was home to many famous criminals including Al Capone. After dinner, the group will learn more about Philadelphia's history through a Ghost Tour of Philadelphia.

## Day Three:

On the final day of the tour, the group will travel to and explore Valley Forge, the site of the 1777-1778 winter encampment of the Continental Army. For lunch, the group will have some free time at the famous Reading Terminal Market and then head over to the Battleship New Jersey Museum and Memorial which was the most decorated battleship to have served in the US Navy and one of the largest ever built. The day concludes with the journey home to your area airport or school.
